#### Q: What is the PSLE score range for Yuying Secondary School?

The 2024 PSLE AL range for Yuying Secondary School is:

#### Q: What is Full Subject-Based Banding (Full SBB)?

Full Subject-Based Banding (Full SBB) is part of MOE's ongoing efforts to nurture the joy of learning and develop multiple pathways to cater to the different strengths and interests of our students. With Full SBB, schools are moving towards a secondary school education where students learn each subject at the level that best caters to their overall strengths, interests and learning needs.

#### Q: What can my child expect in Full SBB?

Under Full Subject-Based Banding (Full SBB), your child can look forward to a more flexible and customised secondary school experience, suited to their strengths, interests, and learning needs.

1. Removal of traditional streams: The previous Express, Normal (Academic), and Normal (Technical) streams have been removed. Instead, students are grouped into Posting Groups 1, 2, or 3, which are similar to these former streams. This change allows more flexibility in subject choices.
2. Mixed form classes: Students join form classes with peers from different Posting Groups. This arrangement encourages them to interact and learn alongside classmates with various abilities and interests, fostering a more inclusive environment.
3. Flexible subject levels: Your child can take subjects at three different levels – G1, G2, and G3 – which align with the former N(T), N(A), and Express standards. They can adjust their subject levels over time based on their progress, strengths, and interests.
4. Taking subjects at a more demanding level: At the start of Secondary One, students with strong PSLE scores in English, Mother Tongue, Mathematics, and Science can opt to take these subjects at a more advanced level.
5. Taking subjects at a less demanding level: Students who studied English, Math, or Science at Foundation level in primary school, but who are otherwise eligible for G3 subjects, can choose to continue at a less demanding level for these subjects. For those with special challenges in Mother Tongue, there are also options to take it at a lower level.

Overall, Full SBB aims to create a more inclusive and tailored learning experience, allowing your child to study subjects at the level that best fits his/her abilities and needs.

**Q: How is the Home-Based Learning (HBL) schedule like in Yuying Secondary School?**

HBL days are usually scheduled once every fortnight. More information will be provided via the school website in early 2025.

**Q: Which Mother Tongue Languages does the school offer?**

We offer Higher Chinese Language, Chinese Language and Malay Language only. Students taking Tamil Language will attend lessons at Umar Pulavar Tamil Language Centre after school on weekdays. Students taking Higher Malay Language will attend lessons at one of the MOE Language Centres after school on weekdays.

**Q: What is the type of Personal Learning Device (PLD) my child will be using?**

Our school's choice of PLD is the Google Chromebook. The PLD will be purchased by every secondary school student as part of the National Digital Literacy Programme (NDLP) to support self-directed and collaborative learning. NDLP aims to equip students with essential digital skills for the future. It focuses on building competencies in finding, evaluating, applying, and creating digital content while promoting safe and responsible use of technology. The programme also emphasises advanced skills like computational thinking, data analysis, and coding, ensuring students become confident and ethical users of digital tools, ready to navigate a technology-driven world.

**Q: What are the start and dismissal times for students at Yuying Secondary School?**

Students are required to report to school by 7:40 am each day. Dismissal times vary based on individual timetables, ranging from 2:00 pm to 3:10 pm. All students are dismissed at 12:40 pm on Fridays.

**Q: Are CCAs compulsory for my child?**

CCA is compulsory for all secondary school students. CCAs are a key component of students' holistic education. Through CCAs, students discover their interests and talents. CCAs also provide platforms for students to develop their character, learn values, social emotional competencies and other relevant skills to prepare them for future challenges.

**Q: When are CCAs held?**

CCAs are held on Tuesdays and Fridays. The sessions are scheduled from 3:00 pm to 6:00 pm on Tuesdays and 2:00 pm to 6:00 pm on Fridays.
